

The 16 to 19 tuition fund 2021 to 2022 academic year – Trinity Solutions Academy.

Children and young people across the country have experienced unprecedented disruption to their education as a result of coronavirus (COVID-19). Those from the most vulnerable and disadvantaged backgrounds will be among those hardest hit. The government announced £1 billion of funding to support children and young people to catch up.

Trinity Solutions Academy fully utilised the funding issued in 20/21, with no underspend. Evaluation at:

- For 21/22 Trinity Solutions Academy will use this funding for their 16–19 Study programme and target support for our learners to catch up for lost teaching over the previous months in line with DFE Guidance and prioritise support for disadvantaged learners.

Learners will be assessed via Skills Forward to identify any significant gaps in their learning and we will hire staff to provide targeted support in maths and English. All work will be planned by our subject specialist tutors.

Our parenting team will survey learners to assess their mental health and identify any issues or concerns.

Learners who have been identified as regressed or in need of mental health support will receive individualised bespoke interventions which could include:

- Small group (maximum of 5) intervention for maths and English
- SEN Small group (maximum of 5) intervention for maths and English
- 1:1 intervention for maths and English (specifically for GCSE learners)
- 1:1 Individualised Support for identified mental health difficulties
- Recovery Curriculum for all learners during Enrichment sessions

All interventions will be reviewed half termly.
